PAPT II SECTION B ENTMY, REATHER, TERRAIN AND S-2 FUNCTIONS

1. ENEMY, MEATHER, TEPPAIN AND S-2 RINCTIONS

a. Enemy Activity. Enemy sightings and contacts increased in this reporting period. The enemy continued his harrassment of small units, C'PP, D' and FF units and his mining/booby trap activities in the TACP. However, the enemy unit contacts in this reporting period were significant during the II phase of K850 campaign in that it continued longer than expected, indicating that the capabilities of the enemy. It was obvious that he still had an adequate supply system. It should also be pointed out that minimum enemy supply system were confiscated by friendly units. This communication system during this campaign was exceptional for the attacks on friendly units were well coordinated.

c. Order of Battle. Although there are no NVA main force units located as a unit in 2/1's TAOR, there has been significant enemy rovement but no change in the overall Order of Battle.

d. Weather and Terrain.

- (1) Weather. The average high temperature was 84 degrees and the average low temperature was 73 degrees with an average humidity of 93%. There was just a trace of rain during this period.
- (2) Terrain. The terrain in 2/1 s TAOR ranges from the flat, sandy land with rice paddies and scattered broken treelines along the coast to mountains that are covered with brushwood. There are two main water transportation routes, the Vinh Dien River in the East and the Yen River in the West. In addition, there are numerous lakes, ronds, and raddies where boat traffic is heavy.


e. S-2 Functions.


(1) <u>Security Clearances</u>: Three security clearances were initiated and none were terminated.

- (2) APVN Interpreters: The S-2 Section has no interpreter assigned to aid 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines.
- (3) S-2 Personnel: The manning level remain constent for this reporting period.
- (4) <u>VIP Funds</u>: The allocation of Voluntary Informant Program funds remain a part of the S-2 function. A total of 14,000 VN \$ were spent during this period. The Voluntary Informant Program is not only a source of intelligence information, but **itsoleliminates** the availability of ordnance to the enemy.
- (5) KCS Program: There are a total of eight YCS's assigned to the Battalion. By walking with the point man on natrols, the KCS are able to act as an early warning for booby traps and ambushes due to their familiarities with the enemy's tactics, habits and signs.
- (6) <u>Training</u>: The S-2 Section continued to furnish instructors on call for indoctrination training. At this time they are briefed on energy, weather, terrain and the capabilities and functions of the S-2 Section.
- (7) <u>Maps</u>: The S-2 office has a full supply of maps of 2/1's T4OR and will continue to supply them as needed.

PART II SECTION C OPERATIONS

1. Operations

- a. Mission. The 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines was assigned the mission to:
- (1) Conduct unilateral and combined offensive operations within the assigned TAOR to locate and destroy enemy forces, installations and IOC, with primary emphasis on those forces and bases which pose the greatest threat to TVN control of important population and economic centers and to the security of friendly military installations.
- (2) Deploy forces throughout assigned TWP to provide defence of the Da Nang vital area and military complex with emphasis on avenues of approach to known/suspected mortar/rocket positions, to include waterways.
 - (3) Be prepared to provide a reaction force for relief of Hoa Vang Jistrict Headquarters and CAP/CUPP's within the TAOR.
 - (4) In cooperation and coordination with FWMAF and District Headquarters, maintain continuous programs to upgrade hamlets within the T40m in accordance with the Pacification Program.
 - (5) Provide security for roadsweeps and other engineer projects as required.
 - (6) Support Revolutionary Development Program within the TAOR.
 - (7) Be prepared to be reinforced and committed anywhere in RVM on 12 hour notice.
 - (8) Be prepared on 48 hour notice to be relieved of present mission and to assume the mission of either of the other Battalions within the 1st Yarine Regiment.


b. Operations

(1) The Battalion continued the concept of neutralizing the Viet Cong infrastructure in it's TAOR. This is the concept of operation that will best benefit the Vietnamization Program during the limited time span that the Battalion will remain in Viet Nam. This concept involves employing as many Marines in the field as possible, conducting saturation patrolling, and utilizing an intensified intelligence effort.



- (2) During the period 1 April through 14 April 1971, this Battalion further expanded it's TAOR to include what was previously 1st Battalion, 1st Marines AO. During this period a continued rocket threat dictated the Battalion's utilization of towers with night observation devices that were used to their fullest capabilities. Despite the use of these devices coupled with continued saturation patrolling, aerial observers and our extensive U.S. intelligence effort, 12 rockets were launched from the Battalion's AO resulting in very little damage to the Da Nang Air Base.
- (3) Operations were characterized by continued close cooperation and liaison with Vietnamese military and civilian officials. The Regional Forces (RF) and Popular Forces (PF) units located within the Battalion TAOR carried an increasing burden of the defense and safeguarding of their areas. Their ever increasing confidence in themselves will insure our ultimate goal of the Vietnamization concept.
- (4) Vietnamese civilians continued to turn in ordnance to 5-5 and units in the field.

2. Air Support


- a. The Battalion's air support for the period covering 1 April through 14 April 1971 was hampered by a restriction on fire support which include close air support (CAS). Operation Scott Orchard which begin 8 April was supported with CAS through 11 April. Helicopters were obtained from MAG-16, and OV 10's (aerial observation aircraft) from MAG-11.
- b. The Battalion had a total of 32 medevac missions between 1 and 14 April, evacuating 51 personnel. There were nine U.S. emergencies, three U.S. priority, eight U.S. routines, eight civilian emergencies, six civilian routines, one civilian routine, 12 ARVN emergencies, three ARVN priorities, and one APVN routine medevac. The shortest delay for an emergency medevac was six minutes and the longest delay was 36 minutes with the average time for an emergency medevac being about 18 minutes. This time was computed from the time the medevac was called into the Battalion COC until the casualty was airborne.
- c. There were 14 resupply missions flown during the 1st and 14th of April. This included 153 lifts, carrying 186 passengers and 445,776 lbs of resupply.
- d. 10 visual reconnaissance (VR) missions were completed during the first half of April. The VR missions was utilized for liaison runs, visual reconnaissance, and administrative runs with passengers.
- e. During Operation Scott Orchard, close air support was flown on four separate occasions for the inserts, resupply and extraction during the entire operation.



3. Artillery and Fire Support

- a. Artillery fire support was provided by Battery B and Battery X, 1st Battalion, 11th Marines and the 3rd 8" inch Howitzer Battery.
- b. During operation Scott Orchard 235 artillery missions were fired in support of the battalion. A total of 432 155mm high explosive rounds and 133 105mm high explosive rounds and 250 105mm CS rounds were fired. No artillery missions were fired within the 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines TACR during the period of 1 April through 15 April 1971.
- c. The 81mm mortar platoon fired 40 high explosive missions and 12 illumination missions between 1 April and 14 April 1971. A total of 261 almm high explosive rounds, 28 81mm WP rounds and 196 81mm illumination rounds were fired during the period. 170 81mm high explosive rounds and 100 81mm illumination rounds were expended outside of 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines TAOR in support of operation Scott Orchard.
- d. The main target for supporting arms in the TAOR remains highly booby trapped areas and enemy havens. Clearance procedure continues to slow down the response time of the supporting arms.








PAPT II SECTION D TRAINING

1 Training

- a. Training primarily consisted of Indoctrination Training for replacements, Resident Schools and Refresher training as required. Such training was limited during this reporting period which was attributed to the cessation of replacement personnel input as the Battalion approaches it's redeployment dates.
 - b. The replacement indoctrination course was broken down as follows:
- (1) Five Day Indoctrination Course. This course is designed for newly joined personnel from CONUS or other out of country commands. During this reporting period, only one Marine was administered the course as he was the only Marine to report to this Battalion from an "Out of Country" command.
- (2) 3 Day Course. This was conducted for replacement personnel joining the Battalion from other "In Country" commands. Such training was designed to desseminate required information, instructions and tactics relevant to the Battalion's TAOR and mission. During this reporting period, five Marines underwent this course.
- c. During this reporting period, four Marines satisfactorily completed the Resident Course of Instructions on Land Mine Warfare which was conducted by 1st Engineer Battalion.

PART II SECTION E LOGISTICS

1. Logistics, Equipment and Supply

a. logistics


- (1) During the period 1 April 1971 through 14 April 1971, resupply of operating units was accomplished by helicopter and trucks. There were a total of 76 helicopter resupply lifts with a total weight of 10816 nounds. Trucks logged approximately 5,153 road miles.
 - (2) There were five work orders completed during this period.
- (3) Approximately 5,675 pounds of laundry was washed and dried at the Laundry Unit at Force Logistics Command.

b. Motor Transport

- (1) Current Status/Forecast
- (a) As of 14 April 1971 there are no M274's at third Echelon Maintenance Shop. There are no M151 jeeps deadlined in Third Echelon Maintenance.
- (b) At present we have two excess M151's and three M37 vehicles on Special Allowance.
 - (c) At present we are not over T/O.
- (d) At this time five M274 mules are in operation. All other M274's are administratively deadlined.
- (e) Five M274's and nine M416 trailers have been inspected and tagged for re-deployment by 1st Medical Battalion.

c. Supply

- (1) There were no changes in the status of Supply Personnel.
- (2) 19 personal effects cases were processed this month, 11 of which were walking medevac's.
- (3) There were 33 ordnance TERO's submitted during the month and 29 of these remain to be completed.
 - (4) The following items were invoiced to the Battalion:



PART II SECTION F CIVIL AFFA & S/STVIC ACTION


1. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

- e. Public Works. Because of the anticipated withdrawal of this Battalion in the near future, building projects have been geared down to minor projects, which can be completed within a few days. To date the only outstanding project is the new village office at Hoa Long. This is nearing completion and should be completed by 30 April 1971. S-5 provided 98 bags of cement, 105 2 by 4's, 50 sheets of 12 inch plywood, 4 20 by 20 beams, 150 foot of 12 inch steel pipe, twenty five neurods of nails and five gallon of paint for this project.
- b. Welfare. During the first two weeks of April a total of 41,600 Vietnamese piasters was paid out for local hire by this command, under the Assistance in Kind employment fund. This program accomplished two basis things; first, it enables needy Vietnamese to earn money on a daily basis for food and living expenses. Secondly, it provides a temporary work force that can perform many of the menial tasks throughout the cantonment. There are a total of 32 Vietnamese civilians working for the Battalian under the Assistance in Kind program. They work and are paid on a daily basis, and receive a maximum of 150 Vietnamese piasters per day.
- c. Education. The S-5 has on a weekly basis, arranged for the U.S. Army Hamlet Education Team to show movies to the school children throughout the A.O. The H.E. team has shown films to a total of 335 children in the hamlets of Thai Cam II, and Xuan Tra. 70 school kits were distributed to the school children in Thai Cam II. These kits contained the basis necessities (pencils, paper erasers) to assist the children in furthering their education.
- d. Health. Because of the vast number of people in our TAOR. S-5 conducts medcaps throughout the A.O. six days a week. 532 Vietnamese Nationals were treated in the field medcaps. In addition, the U.S. Air Force Medcap and Dentcap team conducted a medcap in Hoa Hai village, which treated a total of 310 people in one day. Six Vietnamese civilians were medevaced to Province hospital in Da Nang.
- e. Security. A total of 165 pieces of ordnance were turned over to S-5 personnel under the valuable Informant Program. A total of 10,600 Vietnamese plasters were expended for this ordnance. Various types of ordnance turned in included, two 500 pound bombs, 12 105 rounds, and numerous hand grenades, mortar and small arms rounds.
- f. Solatium. There were no solatium payment made during this reporting period.
- g. Personal Response. There were no Personal Response Indoctrination lectures given during this reporting period.

h. Pyschological Operations. During the reporting period, pyschological operations were fully utilized by S-5. The H.E. team was utilized 13 times. This team participated along with S-5 personnel on one cordon and search operation at Yen the (1). Earlyword was utilized 9 times in the CUPP A.O. The aerial leaflet drops totaled 22,000. A total of 4,000 leaflets were hand distributed throughout the A.O. The Armed Propaganda is presently being utilized in the Le Son (1) and Yen Nhe Hamlets. They secured a list of VCI and guerillas in the area. They are also conducting a census of these hamlets and procuring information on booby traps in this area.


PART II SECTION G COMMUNICATIONS

1. Communications.

- a. During the reported period, the Communications Platoon provided and maintained all normal communications for the Battalion. Emphasis for the period was preparing equipment for embarkation, to include proper preventative maintainance, bringing records up to date and preparing mount out boxes for embark. In addition, the Communication Platoon provided radio and wire communications for a jump command post for an operation the 2d Battalion, 1st Marines participated in from 7 to 11 April 1971.
- b. Radio Relay Section. The Radio Relay Section continued to provide a means by which land line and message traffic could be sent to Regiment. Radio Relay had a total of 4.5% down time, 4.1% of which was due to faulty equipment and 0.4% due to power failure on Hill 34.
- c. Radio Section. The Radio Section continued to provide radio communications within and outside the Battalion. The Radio Section supplied the new company atop Division Ridge with basic radio communications. All equipment was inventoried and missing equipment has been placed on order. In preparing for embarkation, Radio has reconditioned approximately 50% of its equipment. In addition, Radio set up communications for a Battalion jump command post from 7 to 11 April 1971.
- d. Wire Section. The Wire Section continued to provide wire and telephone service to all agencies within the Battalion cantonement. The Wire Section rewired the entire Division Ridgeline for the new company which was to occupy it. The majority of the reported period was spent reconditioning wire equipment and bringing records up to date. In addition, wire sent a minimum of wire communications to the forward jump command post in order to facilitate communications within the command post.
- e. Message Center Section. Teletype and courier service for the reporting period totaled 33 messages sent out and 455 messages received. Due to Radio Relay and power failures, the message center had a total of fifty three hours and twenty minutes down time. Down time is broken down as indicated below:

PART II SECTION H MEDICAL & DENTAL

1. Medical and Dental

- a. The Battalion Aid Station treated 350 patients: during the period of 1 April to 14 April 1971. The Division Preventive Medicine Units Monthly Sanitation Inspection Report was submitted and the discrepancies were noted and corrected.
- b. Analysis of mortality figures reveals that there were zero USMC KIA, zero USMC DOW, eight USMC WIA, one USMC NBC, zero USMC DAY, zero USMC WAINE, and zero USMC MIA. There was zero USN KIA, one USN WIA, and zero USN NBC.
- c. The civilian medical program was active. There were 4,165 Vietnamese civilians, and three Vietnamese civilians were treated for dental reasons.
 - d. There were three USMC evacuated.
- e. There was a total of 23 patients sent on consultations to 1st Medical Battalion, or 95 Evacuation Hospital.
- f. There were none dental patients sent to 1st Medical Battalion on consultations.





PART II SECTION I CHAPLAIN

1. Chaplain's Activity.

- a. For this reporting period the Battalion Chaplain conducted 14 services with 192 men attending. The Battalion had six Catholic Services during this same period with 104 men attending. Four were conducted by Chaplain WOOTEN, Division Chaplain and two by Chaplain MINIJAL, assistant Regimental Chaplain. The Battalion Chaplain saw 17 men for individual counselling. Four of these required assistance from the American Red Cross. There were six visits made to the various hospitals in the area with 31 patients visited.
