
#### 2. ENEMY, WEATHER, AND TERRAIN


a. General. Notwithstanding on increase in minor enemy-initiated incidents, overall contact in the QUANG THI area of operations remained light to moderate. Two squad-sized herassing attacks were launched against USMC night defensive positions; amiping incidents increased sharply. Enemy mining activity decreased slightly, with twenty-three (23) mines found and only four (4) detonated by Marines during the month. The rewards program dropped off slightly, but the enemy ordnance obtained was never and more serviceable.

At CON THIEN, enemy artillery and morter fire dropped off considerably from the previous weeks. The holiday "truce periods" fell within the 2nd Battalion's tenure, accounting for the abnormally quiet atmosphere. Contact was libited to infrequent sniping incidents directed at friendly defensive positions. Air observers, observation posts, and electronic devices continued to disclose a substantial amount of enemy movement in the surrounding areas. Agent reports indicate that the enemy is present in the immediate area of CON THIEN in regimental strength, but his forces are presently not massed; their mission is to harrass friendly forces and disrupt the Dyemarker Project.

#### o. Order of Battle.

The 90th NVA Regiment, with a reported strength of 2000 men, located in northern QUANG TRI Province. The subordinate units, which operate in the area of CON THIEN, are listed below:

- (1) HQ Battalion, 90th NVA Regiment, with a reported strength of 800 men. Last verified report was at YD 0675 on 25 April 1967.
- (2) 7th Battalion, 9th NVA Regiment, with an estimated strength of 400 men. Last verified report was at YD 125725 on 8 July 1967.
- (3) 8th Battalion, 90th NVA Regiment, also reported as having 400 men. Last verified report was at YD 115719 on 10 October 1966.
- (4) 9th Battalion, 90th NVA Reiment, with an ostimated strongth of 400 men. Last verified report was at YD 1437C3 on 3 July 1967.

#### d. Weather and Terrain.


- (1) <u>Yeather</u>. December's weather was generally milder than expected. Ten consecutive days of good weather improved roads and traffic bility and allowed greater maintenance and improvements of roads and defensive positions at CON THIEN. Rainfall did not appreciably affect combat operations.
- (2) Terrain. The A-4 strongpoint lies on three knolls on the high ground of NUI CON FADEN, with a commanding view and fields of fire to the northeast, north, and west. While the ground has been cleared of vegetation for several hundred meters in front of the protective wire, the terrain is deceptive in that its mild convolution's offer considerable concealment to the enemy. In the surrounding area, tiered rice paddies, hamlet complexes, and trails once existed, but have long been abandoned. The paddy areas are still generally open, but the untellivated areas are now overgrown with facely dense foliage.

#### 3. ORGANIZATION AND OFFRATIONS

a. <u>General</u>. In addition to daily patrols and arbushes in the Bettalion Area of Operations intensive work was conducted in NHU LE hamlet to deny the enemy access to that portion of the AID as well as to prevent infiltration toward QUIFG TRI along the eastern brank of the SONG THACH HAN.

During the period 9-12 December Company H, 2nd Battalion, 4th Marines was attached to this battalion and participated with the Command Group and Companies F and G in an operation in the vicinity of hill #80 (YD 247493). The battalion was helicifited into the area acting on new reports of entertainty caches being located there.

On 22 December 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines shifted to the operational control of 9th Marines and commenced its movement to A-4 strongpoint (CON THIEN) to relieve in place 1st Bn, 1st Marines. Companies B and F and the Command Group moved by truck convoy on 22 December, and Companies G and H moved on the following day. The primary mission of the battalion at CON THIEN was given as defense of the base and surveillance of the surrounding areas. This mission is directly related to the DYFMARKER Project of which A-4 is one strongpoint, and the task organization of artillary and counter artillary units from 12th Marines and 44th Artillary, U.S. Army, anables the battalion to carry on its screening operations.

A cease-fire was properly observed from 1800 24 December until 1800 25 December for Christmes and another cease-fire commenced at 1800 31 December to last until 1800 01 January 1968.

#### b. Air Support

(1) lat Herin's Advereft Wing helicopter in support of 2nd Battalion, lat Marines lifted 5 USMC WIA and 2 USMC till on 7 emergency medevac missions. In addition there were 3 priority medevac missions lifting 3 USMC WIA. Three routine medevacs were also flown lifting 2 USMC WIA. and 2 USMC WIA.


Four reconnectedance flights were made turing the month carrying unit occmendance and staff personnel over plannel operating areas. Three peasement cleans were made at 2nd Battalian, let Marines LZ.


(2) There were 3 close air support service flown in December. Ordnance dropped included 30-250 1b bombs, 4-500 1b Neplan bombs, and 400 rounds 20mm. These air strikes accounted for 5 enemy bunkers destroyed, two bunkers demaged, three fighting holes destroyed and 80 meters of trench line destroyed. No secondary explosions were observed.

#### c. Artill my and Phrei Support

During Lecenter artillery fired 503 missions expending 4,294 rounds in direct support of 2nd Battelian, 1st Durings in the 18014. Supplementing these called fires were 667 pre-lenner 405 fires expending 4,352 rounds. The lettelian Slam morbar playeon fired 410 missions expending 6,780 rounds. Their Hall program contrated of 391 targets upon which 7,963 rounds were expended.

During the per of 1-22 December 2nd Battalica, 1st Marines was supported by Battary 12-1 let Battalion, 11th Marines. From 23 December through 31 December this buttalion was supported by 2 batteries of 2nd Battalion, 12th Marines in direct support. In general support were the combined battaries of 12th Marines plus additional units of the 44th Artillery, U.S. Arty.





#### 4. TRAINING

Company G administered to its personnel the courses in General Military Subjects and weepons training which the other companies had completed during November. A similar program was originated in H&S Company, and training was conducted on a daily basis for small groups from each section. H&S received instruction in First Aid, N=50 machinegum indoctrination and familiarization firing, Miner and Boobytraps, and employment of demolitions and Claymore mines.

The Battalion 81mm Mortar Platoon, 106mm Recoiless Rifle Platoon, and Flamethrower section also trained independently, and displaced to fire their weapons in the unpopulated area south of the Battalion Base Camp. Personnel in the 106 Platoen and Flamethrower Section were also cross trained on both weapons.

During December 132 replacement personnel received instruction on the M-16 rifle including care and cleaning, malfunctions, and techniques of fire. All new personnel fired 300 rounds for familiarization with the weapon.

#### 5. LOGISTICS AND SUPPLY

#### a. Logistics

(1) All classes of supply were adequate to meet requiremmets during December.

#### b. Supply


#### (1) Problem Areas

- c. Motor Trans ort. Spare parts as listed in paragraph 5. b.(1)
  (a), continued in a critical status during December.
- d. Roads. Access Roads and MSR's remained passable, no obstructions were encountered during December.
- e. Fiscal Obligations. Obligations during December for PSA items was \$100,214.59.
- f. Equipment Repairs. During December 85 Tactical Equipment Repair Orders were submitted to FLSU. Of these, 31 were completed. As of .30 December 32 items of combat essential equipment were coadlined.
- g. Miscellaneous. Following displacement of the rifle companies and Command Group to CON THIEN on 22-23 December service and support personnel continued to work from the Base Camp at QUANG TRI. A supplementary Logistics Support Area was established at DONG HA to provide closer support of the Battalion at the forward position.

#### 6. CIVIC ACTION

The first Medcaps were held at the new Medcap Station early in December, and through the month medical treatments were given at the station on 20 days. Over 2,000 people came to the Station for observation or treatment.

Special work was done in HAI PHU Village where over 50 percent of the residents are refugees from North Victum. Jobs were provided on a partitum basis to several people to make repairs on the read through the village Tools for the project were provided jointly by this Esttalian and lat Marines. Building materials of lumbor and tin were given to the people to make repairs on their dwellings; 57 blankets and many items of clothing were also distributed in HAI PRU.

Givil Affairs personnel responded to the needs of two local families whose sons were killed by the explosion of a dud morter projectile which they were bringing to the 2nd Battalion Base Camp . Caskets were purchased and given to the families, solution payments were made, and food and clothing were also given to the parents of the two boys.

A collection point for ordnence returned through the Rewards Program was established at the Medcap Station. Response to this program continued to be favorable.

On 24 December Christnes presents were distributed to children in the local schools. The 3,000 gifts were purchased with \$135 denated for that purpose by Marines in the Dattalion. A part of the gifts came from those section.



#### 7. PSYCHOLOGICAL WARVARE

One psywar project was undertaken during December in connection with the aid given to the families of the boys killed by the dud mortar explosion. Broadcasts were made to counteract any possible Viet Cong propaganda efforts in that hanlet, and publicity was given to the sympathetic response of the local Marines to the needs of these families.

Other psychological warfare efforts were ineffective due to a shortage of materials and supplies.

#### 8. COMMUNICATIONS

Normal communications operations encountered no significant problems during the month of December. On 18 December an advance party of all sections in the communications platoon went to CON THIEN to arrange for installation of wire and radio equipment prior to the displacement of the Battalion on 22-23 December. Five switchboards were installed at CON THIEN and telephones were put in place at all critical positions and observation posts. Line repairs became a matter for immediate attention due to damage of wires by the weather, and by heavy earth moving equipment and vehicles operating in the combat base.

A normal redio communications center was established in the COC at CON THIEN, and radio capabilities were maintained at the rear base camp to monitor all designated tactical nets. An additional net was established to handle administration traffic and all logistics and resupply matters with a relay station operating at the LSA at DONG HA.

#### 9. MEDICAL AND DENTAL

The Battalion Aid Station treated nine (9) combat casualties and 690 sick call patients during December. At the Aid Station at CON THIEN there were eight (8) combat casualties and 47 Non-combat casualties treated.

There were no serious outbreaks of gastroenteritis, malaria, or other diseases, and there were no cases of immersion foot reported or treated.

All personnel requiring dental treatment were referred to 1st Marines 1 Aid Station.

#### 10, CHAPLAIN

- a. <u>Protestant Divine Services</u>. The Battalion Chaplain, LAUG JAMES W. GHER, CHC, USHR, is Protestant. Twenty-four Protestant Services were held during December; 480 people attended. Nine Sunday services were held at CON THEIN.
- b. Catholic Divine Services Six Catholic Services were held at CON THIEN for 2nd Battalion, 1st Marines.



- c. <u>Lay Leador Service</u>. One Latter Day Saints service was held in the Bettalion at CON THIEN, 4 persons attended.
- d. <u>Visits</u>. Three visits were made to "B" Medical Hospital and two visits to "D" Medical Hospital. Patients in the ward at the Battalian Ald Station were also visited regularly.
- e. <u>Counseling Sessions</u>. The Battalion Chaplain counseled with 16 Marines regarding personal matters.
- f. Red Cross Messages. The Battalion Chaplain delivered six Red Cross messages.


#### 1. SITUATION

## a. Enemy Forces.

- (1) The enemy has concentrated numerous Infantry and Artillery Units in the A-4 strong point (CON THIEN) area. The 324th B NVA Division, Elements of the 325th C NVA Division, the 270th NVA Regiment and the 104th NVA Artillery Regiment are known to be operating in the CON THIEN area. Additional enemy Artillery Units are positioned North of the A-4 (CON THEEN) in the TMZ area within Artillery Range.
- (2) Enemy activity against the A-4 (CON THIEN) strong point have consisted mainly of attacks by fire, including heavy multi-claiber Artillery fire, Mortar fire, large and small caliber Rocket fire and Recoiless Rifle fire. Enemy ground activity has been characterized by probing and harassing tactics, large scale ambushes, and continuous efforts to infiltrate men and supplies South across the DMZ.
