2. Sequential listing of significant events.

a. Personnel - During the reported period the BLT suffered the following casualties.

(1) WIA - Six Marines suffered from wounds inflicted by punji stakes. One Marine was injured by an exploding round.

(2) NBC - 33 Marines became heat casualties and were evacuated from the zone of action.

b. Intelligence.

(1) Preoperation intelligence was limited to intelligence summaries, direct liaison with units familiar with the target areas and photo reconnaissance. In most cases the only available information about target areas was from readouts of aerial photos provided by TF 78. Interpretation of the photos improved from the first target to the last target for this series of operations.

Comment: Since photo reconnaissance is the main source of preoperation intelligence, more and better photos of all types (verticals, stereo-pairs and obliques) of the targets are needed. The number of copies available was marginally sufficient for planning.

Recommendation: That complete aerial photo coverage of each target be made and sufficient copies be distributed for planning and unit briefing.

(2) Intelligence during operations was derived mainly through interrogation of VCS and inhabitants of the target areas. This was an excellent opportunity to acquire detailed knowledge of both the area and enemy activities; however, the amount of information that can be gathered appears directly proportional to the ability to communicate in the native language.

Comment: A problem was encountered in this area because only a few translators, who could speak both English and Vietnamese well enough to be of use in intelligence gathering, were available.

Recommendation: Insure qualified interpreter-translators are assigned to the SLF.

(3) Post operations intelligence consisted of preparing answers to EEI's and reporting information gathered, to the higher commands. Information obtained on the target areas was generally helpful in increasing the general knowledge of the coastal areas of RVN and the effort as a whole must be considered successful.

c. Training.

(1) Upon completion of embarkation at White Beach, Okinawa daylight and night-time helicopter debarkation drills were conducted aboard the LPH.

(2) Throughout the period covered by this report the physical conditioning of the BLT personnel received command attention at all echelons. One hour each day, except when committed to land operations, was devoted to physical conditioning by each unit.

(3) 13-19 September 1965 - BLT 2/1 initiated a program, in coordination with BLT 2/7, whereby one rifle platoon from our BLT rotated daily to operate within the BLT 2/7 TAOR. Each platoon spent approximately 24 hours ashore conducting reconnaissance patrols and/or establishing defensive positions.

(4) 23 September 1965 - A rehearsal was conducted at CHU LAI, RVN, in preparation for the forthcoming DAGGER THRUST Operations.

d. Special Operations.

(1) 10-22 September 1965 - This BLT was placed in a six hour reaction status during this time. Our mission was to be prepared to assist in providing protection to the landing of the First Air Cavalry Division, USA as directed. See enclosure (2).

(2) 25-26 September 1965 - Operation DAGGER THRUST, Target # 2, VUNG MU Peninsula, RVN. See enclosure (3) and (4).

(3) 28 September 1965 - Operation DAGGER THRUST, Target # 4, HON LON Island, RVN. See enclosures (5) and (6).

(4) 1-2 October 1965 - Operation DAGGER THRUST, Target # 11, TAM QUAN Village, Binh Dinh Province, RVN. See enclosures (7) and (8).

(5) 3 October 1965 - As a member of the TG 78.5 the BLT moved from the Republic of South Viet Nam and proceeded to positions at sea to the North of the Republic of Indonesia, prepared to conduct military operations required for the protection and evacuation of the U.S. non-combatants and other designated persons.

(6) 8 October 1965 - Placed on 96 hour reaction time for DAGGER THRUST Missions or evacuation of U.S. non-combatants and other designated persons from Indonesia. Elements of the BLT embarked aboard USS TALLEDAGA and USS POINT DEFIANCE proceeded to Subic Bay. The remainder of the BLT proceeded to Da Nang, RVN for offloading of HMM 163 and to embark HMM 261.

e. Logistics - Significant aid to the logistics support of operations ashore during the reported period was the addition of a supply serialization annex to each administrative order published. Prior to each operation, a logistical estimate was formulated by the S-4 and units of supplies were serialized in accordance with expected needs.

An example is as follows:

Serial 401 10 cases 7.62 Ball  
402 25 Water cans  
403 25 cases MIC

The serials were prestaged on the shipping involved in the operation allowing the Battalion S-4 wide flexibility in selecting supplies to be brought ashore and speeding up delivery after the request was received at TACLOG. This system of requesting supplies kept messages short and simple and during short operations (24 to 36 hours) allowed the Battalion S-4 to avoid building an excess of supplies ashore.

f. Civil affairs/military government/community relations - Leaflets explaining the intentions of the landing force and advising the populace that the marines were searching for Viet Cong were distributed in the target areas. Corpsman on the rifle company level administered first aid to Vietnamese who had been injured in the target areas. During the target # 2 operation a Vietnamese woman, who claimed her husband had been murdered by the Viet Cong, requested protection by the marines. She and her two children were evacuated to the 22nd ARVN Division CP, Qui Nhon, RVN.

1. ENEMY

- a. Units in contact. There were no known organized Viet Cong Units.
- b. Enemy reserves that can affect our situation. One Local Force Company that has been operating near the objective area could reinforce the guerrilla units. This capability would not alter the accomplishment of the RIF's mission.
- c. Enemy activity during period.
  - (1) There were isolated cases of sniper fire during the hours of daylight and movement in front of company defensive positions by small groups during the hours of darkness. The only tactics employed by the VC at night, were stone throwing and noise making. The reason for this was to draw the fire of Marines thus giving away their positions.
  - (2) The hamlets of Tuy Phong 7 (1), Vinh Cuu Phu (1), (2), and (3), Vinh Cuu An, and Vinh Cuu Le (1) and (2) had been extensively tunneled as well as being booby-trapped with man traps and pungi sticks.
- d. Estimate of enemy strength, material, means, morale, and his probable knowledge of our situation.
  - (1) During the 10 day period prior to D-Day, the estimated VC strength in the objective area was one platoon. This does not include the VC village administrators, political cadre etc. Unconfirmed reports, based on interrogation reports indicate that between 50 to 100 VC guerrillas visit the hamlet of Tuy Phuong 7 (1) every 5 to 6 days, remaining for a day and leaving.
  - (2) Civilian interrogation during the early hours of the operation indicated that all but a few of the local guerrilla force on Vung Mu Peninsula left for the mainland area during the early morning hours of 25 September 1965. The remaining VC guerrillas attempted to escape across to the mainland during the first hours after our landing.
  - (3) It can be assumed that the VC did have knowledge of our landing for the below listed reasons:
    - (a) Prepared hamlet defenses were void of VC personnel and there were numerous traps in and around the prepared positions.

- (b) Movement in and out of the Vung Mu area by local guerrillas as well as the number of guerrillas increased during the 10 days prior to 25 September 1965.
- (c) The VC guerrilla unit operating in the Tuy Phuong 7 (1) and Thach Khe hamlet area have established additional checkpoints in and around the hamlet of Long Thanh (1). Local civilians traveling north on National Route #1 and from the Vung Mu Peninsula were stopped and their movement curtailed. This was a change in the VC policy taking effect approximately a week prior to D-Day.
- (d) The vehicle traffic at night in the Thac Khe hamlet along National Route #1 increased during the week prior to D-Day.
- (e) The VC guerrillas established "lookouts" or guards along the coast in the objective area using villagers from Tuy Phuong 7 (1) to watch for the approach of ships approaching the target area.

c. Conclusions. The enemy can:

- (1) Withdraw all of his forces from the objective area leaving only local Viet Cong administrators.
- (2) Withdraw, leaving small groups (3 to 4 man teams) for harassment and infiltration tactics.
- (3) Defend present positions with forces available.
- (4) Reinforce his positions with up to one (1) Local Force Company.

2. OWN SITUATION

a. Front lines, command posts and boundaries. See Annex A (Operation Overlay).

b. Own Operations During Period.

- (1) The assault Companies of the BLT, Companies "E" and "P" landed over RED BEACH and in LZ BUZZARD at H/L hour (0700H) without opposition. Leaflets were dropped by aircraft over the populated areas during the initial landing. These leaflets explained the intention and purpose of the landing force.
- (2) The BLT Command Post was established ashore vic coordinates 137002 by 0820H.

- (3) Company "E" moved on a direction of attack securing LZ CROW at 0835H and the southern portion of the peninsula at Hill 64 (coordinates 140982).
- (4) Upon landing Company "F" moved in the attack to the northern end of the peninsula establishing a blocking position extending from coordinates 082080 to coordinates 087082.
- (5) At H+15 minutes Company "G" landed in trace of Company "E" and proceeded to coordinates 125005 securing LZ VULTURE.
- (6) Company "G" landed, as ordered, in LZ CROW at 0834H occupying positions vicinity coordinates 140982 to 142988.
- (7) At 0945 Company "E" commenced to search for and capture or destroy all VC personnel and material in assigned zone of action.
- (8) At 1137H Company "G" passed through Company "E" executing assigned mission. Numerous man traps (pungi) and isolated rifle fire were encountered upon entering Vinh Cum Phui (2).
- (9) At 1252H Company "H" commenced a search and capture or destroy operation along the western edge of AHK zone of action.
- (10) At 1315H permission was granted from CTG 78.3 to extend the northern limit of advance. Company "H" zone of action was extended north, and a link was established with Company "F" (See Appendix I to Annex A). Company "F" was assigned the mission to search and capture or destroy personnel VC and material in the hamlet of Tuy Phong (1), coordinates 075080;
- (11) The Landing Force Reserve was landed at 1700H and established defense for the AHK Command Post.
- (12) Companies occupied defensive positions on the night of D-Day as follows:
  - (a) Company "E" - From 153988 to 157005.
  - (b) Company "F" - From 082080 to 086080.
  - (c) Company "G" - From 138984 to 143984.
  - (d) Company "H" - From 082080 to 086080.
- (13) At coordinates 160006 unknown number of persons threw rocks and conducted loud conversations in an apparent attempt to have Company "E" disclose its positions.

- (14) At about 0436H H&S Company reported an incoming 60MM Mortar round, fired from an unknown location, landed vicinity coordinates 130000.
- (15) A planned withdrawal was conducted on D+1 commencing at 0800H and completed at 1402H. The withdrawal was conducted as scheduled with one M48A3 Tank submerged and recovered. It was deadlined in accordance with U. S. Marine Corps Technical Instructions (TI-8005-25/9).

c. Combat efficiency. Morale and combat efficiency remains excellent.

d. Results of Operations.

- (1) Entire target area was searched for all Viet Cong personnel and material.
- (2) During the operation 28 villagers were confined in the BLT POW Compound. Intensive interrogation established one VC suspect who was subsequently evacuated to 22nd ARVN Division CP, Qui Nhon. All other personnel were released.
- (3) Villagers were allayed of initial fear by civic action conducted by units of the command and by the presence of the distributed leaflets.

3. PERSONNEL

a. Strengths.

(2) Casualties:

- a. Wounded in Action (WIA). Three Marines suffered wounds from pungi sticks and were evacuated to LPN-2.
- b. Wounded in Action Not Evacuated (WIANE). Three Marines suffered wounds from pungi sticks, were treated on the Unit level and returned to duty.
- c. Non-Battle Casualty (NBC). Eight Marines were heat casualties. Seven were evacuated to the LPN-2 and one to the XLT Aid Station. All were returned to duty after the operation.

▲ Casualties resulted in a .008% temporary loss of BMT strength.

- b. Personnel Interrogated. Twenty-eight Vietnamese were interrogated at the BMT Prisoners of War Compound. Twenty-seven were released and returned to their villages. One suspect was turned over to the 22nd ARVN Division at Qui Nhon.
- c. Morale. The morale of all personnel of the BMT was extremely high.
- d. Civic Action. Leaflets were dropped prior to landing. These informed the inhabitants of the BMT's desire that the Vietnamese keep away from the fighting while the Marines searched for Viet Cong. During the operation interpreters informed the people of the necessity of Units being in the villages and that it was only a temporary inconvenience. During the search of villages, corpsmen administered First Aid to Villagers who had minor cuts and bruises. Individual Marines shared their small quantity of chewing gum with the Vietnamese. A Vietnamese woman with her two children, claiming her husband had been killed by the Viet Cong, requested protection. She and her children were evacuated to the 22nd ARVN Division at Qui Nhon.

1. ENEMY

- a. Units in contact. There was no contact ashore between U. S. Forces and the Viet Cong.
- b. Enemy reserves that can affect our situation. There were none in the immediate objective area.
- c. Enemy activity during period. Force Recon Teams ashore observed a few junks moving along the coast of H on Lon Island during the hours of darkness. Approximately 22 VC were spotted along the beach (vic coordinates 275975). Several appeared to be standing guard near a cave while the remainder were transferring equipment from the cave to an area not within sight of the Recon's observation.
- d. Estimate of enemy strength, materiel, means, morale and his probable knowledge of our situation. Viet Cong strength on the Ben Goi Peninsula was estimated to be one platoon. It was apparent from local activity that the VC and villagers had no prior knowledge of our proposed landing or that we even had personnel ashore.
- e. Conclusions. The VC Forces present in the Ben Goi area would most likely withdraw to the mainland and not attempt to defend the objective area.

2. OWN SITUATION

- a. Front Lines, Command Post and Boundaries. CP located LPH-2.
- b. Own operations during period.
  - (1) Company "G" was assigned the mission of providing three immediate reaction teams in direct support of Force Reconnaissance Teams operating in Target #4. Detachment First Force Reconnaissance Company was under operational control of TR 76.3. The Immediate Reaction Force consisted of three 28 man teams. One team was on a thirty minute ready room alert and two teams were on a one hour ship alert. The alert status was rotated among the three teams every four hours.
  - (2) At 281125H BLT 2/1 received an order from TF 76.3 to launch immediate reaction team to locate and recover reconnaissance team #31.
  - (3) At 281140H an immediate reaction team was launched from the LPH-2, but was forced to return without accomplishing mission due to mechanical failure of an aircraft.

- (4) At 281155H Company "F" was given a mission to "land on Hon Lon Island, search the western half of island for reconnaissance team #31 and recover same."
- (5) At 281225H a second immediate reaction team was launched from the LPH-2 to search for and assist in the recovery of reconnaissance team #31. However, it was never necessary for this team to be landed.
- (6) At 281255H, leading elements of Company "F" were launched from the LPH-2. They were, however, recalled before landing.
- (7) At 281329H the missing reconnaissance team #31 was located and recovered by HM-163.
- (8) By 281355H all units from BLT 2/1 were returned to the LPH-2.

- a. Combat efficiency. Combat efficiency remains excellent.
- b. Results of operations. Missing reconnaissance Team #31 was recovered.





1. ENEMY

- a. Units in contact. There were no known organized Viet Cong units in contact with U. S. Forces while ashore.
- b. Enemy reserves that can affect our situation. It was estimated that the VC could reinforce the objective area with up to one (1) Main Force (MF) Battalion, two (2) MF Companies, supported by eight (8) Local Force (LF) Companies within a 24-48 hour period. One factor affecting the reinforcing capability of VC units to be considered; to what extent were VC units from the objective area committed in the Bien Son operation to the south.
- c. Enemy activity during period.
  - (1) The Viet Cong fired small arms at U. S. Forces during the landing and then withdrew. Throughout the remainder of the operation, contact was limited to SA fire, 50 Cal. Machine Gun fire and scattered 60MM Mortar rounds.
  - (2) The villages in the objective area had been tunneled extensively. Pungi stakes and booby-traps were abundant. The VC forced the villagers to construct two (2) booby-traps in each of their houses.
  - (3) As the last elements of U. S. Forces were withdrawing from the objective area, the VC started to move over the Hill 171 (BS 9015) in large numbers toward the RED BEACH area. The VC were taken under fire by ONTOS and Aircraft.
- d. Estimate of enemy strength, materiel, means, morale and his probable knowledge of our situation. The VC strength in the objective area was estimated to be one Company. Materiel available from local sources and from the sea infiltration supply routes has been sufficient for VC logistics and military operations. There was no indication that either the villagers or the Viet Cong had any prior knowledge that U. S. Forces were planning an operation or landing in the Tam Quan area.
- e. Conclusions. The enemy can:
  - (1) Withdraw all of his forces from the objective area.
  - (2) Defend with forces presently available.
  - (3) Counterattack while U. S. Forces are in the process of withdrawing from the objective area.

- (4) Reinforce with up to one (1) MF Battalion and from 8-10 MF or LF Companies.

2. OWN SITUATION

a. Boundaries and Command Posts. See Annex A (Situation Overlay).

b. Own operations during period.

- (1) Company "E" as assault element of the BLT, landed on RED BEACH (coordinated 932145) at H-Hour (0640H) encountering sporadic small arms fire from the left flank. All scheduled waves were landed by 0650H. Leaflets, explaining the intention and purpose of the landing force, were dropped by aircraft over the populated area.
- (2) RED BEACH was protected with barbed wire, pungi stakes and limited trenches. Tracked vehicles were unable to traverse the sand dunes and trenches on the beach. Company "E" was compelled to dismount from LVTP and proceeded on foot to seize objective A. Tracked vehicles finally egressed at the extreme northern end of beach area.
- (3) At 0645H Company "H" landed over RED BEACH and proceeded to seize and occupy objective B.
- (4) Company "G" landed at L-Hour (1015H) in T-2 DIANG and blocked the northern entrance to objective C. By 1100H objective C was secured with no enemy contacted or material discovered in the tunnel.
- (5) Resistance throughout assigned zones of action was limited to sporadic small arms fire and some automatic weapons fire. No main or local force units were engaged or identified.
- (6) Company "F" was landed on RED BEACH the afternoon of D-Day for further transfer to LVTP for shore to shore operations against Cuu Loi (1) Peninsula. Upon landing at GREEN BEACH at 1715H small arms fire was received from the right flank. The Company searched an area extending 150 meters south and 600 meters north of GREEN BEACH with no enemy contact. At 2100H the Company withdrew from the beach and returned to RED BEACH for reassignment as BLT reserve.
- (7) Night time activity was restricted to security patrolling within the TAOR and H&I fire missions conducted by 81MM Mortar Platoon, 107MM Mortar Battery and NGF units. Some small arms fire and scattered mortar rounds were received throughout the night.
- (8) Company "F" returned to Cuu Loi (1) at 0645H on D+1 to continue search and destroy operations, withdrawing on order at 0800H to RED BEACH for backloading to original shipping.
- (9) The withdrawal was conducted as scheduled under light sniper fire; however, there was no delay in the execution of the withdrawal.

- c. Combat efficiency. Morale and combat efficiency remains excellent.
- d. Result of operations. Search and capture or destroy operations within the assigned TAOR resulted in the killing of an estimated ten (10) VC. Nineteen (19) Vietnamese were detained, interrogated and released.

- (1) Wounded in Action (WIA). One Marine suffered an eye wound from flying splinters caused by an exploding round and was evacuated to the LPH-2.
- (2) Non-Battle Casualties (NBC). Twenty-five Marines were heat casualties and were evacuated to the LPH-2. One Marine sprained his ankle and another tore the ligaments in his knee. Both were evacuated to the LPH-2 for treatment.
- (3) Casualties resulted in a .016% temporary loss to the BLT strength.
- c. Personnel Interrogated. Nineteen (19) Vietnamese were interrogated at the BLT Prisoner of War Compound. All were released and returned to their villages.
- d. Morale. The morale of all personnel of the BLT was extremely high.
- e. Civic Action. Eight (8) Vietnamese came to the BLT Aid Station for treatment of minor injuries. Medical aid was rendered and the personnel returned to their village.

2. MISSION

a. To establish and maintain communications in support of assigned missions of BLT 2/1.

3. EXECUTION

a. Communication Platoon, BLT 2/1.

- (1) Provide troop message center service for Headquarters BLT 2/1 and other units embarked therewith aboard USS IWO JIMA, LPH-2.
- (2) Provide message routing facility for troop units aboard USS TALLADEGA (APA-208)
- (3) Land on order. Be prepared to support landing plans as promulgated.
- (4) Activate radio relay circuits to higher commands while aboard ship as directed

b. Coordination Instructions.

- (1) CTG 76.5 provides entry into the world wide communication system.
- (2) SFCMC/Taclog will be formed aboard LPH and will initially handle tactical log traffic once the landing force is established ashore this circuit will become adminship/shore.
- (3) All radio equipment ashore will be portable.
- (4) The TACP with associated equipment will be attached to the Air Liaison Officer.

- (6) Report to BLT CP, incidents of suspected enemy caused interference on Radio Nets via other means of communications.
- (7) FSCC will be activated ashore with 61MM Co "F", Arty Group Co "F", TAR and NGF nets.
- (8) The FIC may be airborne using the T.CI local frequency to receive requests for aircraft from all companies ashore.
- (9) Frequencies will be in accordance with Appendix 1, radio plan to annex D (Communications-electronics) to OpOrder 201-65.
- (10) On order second AN/FRT-10 in rifle companies will be used as Battalion admin circuit on an as required basis.
- (11) All stations are subordinate to Battalion and will dial to Battalion frequencies regardless. (See frequency plan for all frequencies).
- (12) Be prepared to activate AN/FRT-47 teams for special missions.
- (13) All stations will remain on BLT TAC until back aboard ship at which time they will be secured by the BLT.

1. Helicopter Landing Points (Communications)

- a. To prevent unnecessary landing at helicopter landing points when there is no outgoing traffic the letter "N" will be displayed in the immediate vicinity of the landing point marking panels.

2. Helicopter Landing Point Marking System

- a. All landing points will be marked with an equilateral triangle by using three panels from either AP-30C or AP-30D. The color selection will contrast with the landing point in order to be easily recognized by aircraft.
- b. Prevailing wind direction will be shown by installing a short pole (approximately 3 ft) with streamers, flag or pennants of sufficient length to allow the pilot to see the local wind direction.
- c. Once the helicopter point has been established with the triangle the type and size of the unit will be identified as follows.
  - (1) Type of unit. Identified by one or more panels in the center of the triangle.

Infantry/Recon	One yellow panel(VS-6/u)
Artillery/Tanks	One red panel(VS-4/u)
Service and Support	Two red panels(VS-4/u)

- (2) Size of unit. Identified by one or more panels from panel set AP-30B or AP-30D placed directly above and centered on top of the triangle.

- (3) Upon receiving an air raid warning/alert, the Helicopter landing point display will be removed without delay.


- (4) Marking of Night Landing Points. The boundaries of all points used for night operations should be marked with at least four low intensity lights on the outer perimeter of the point. The complete area between the lights must be suitable for landing.





c. Recaptured Allied Military Personnel

- (2) Evacuation will be by way of normal troop casualty channels.

d. Prisoners of War

c. Ashore.

- (1) Upon commitment of the BLT ashore for an extended period of time all administration will revert to the BLT level under the supervision of the Adjutant. Upon receipt of the order that BLT administration is to be established each Reporting Unit Code will have his SRB and Unit Diary Clerk report to Battalion Admin Center. They will bring all their files, directives and office equipment (Field Desk, Typewriter, Embossing Machine, Imprinter, Camp Stool). Admin Chief of Company "G" will report to the Admin Center for duty. In the event the BLT re-embarks upon shipping the BLT Admin Center will be dissolved and each RUC will revert to its status prior to the landing.
- (2) Upon commitment of the BLT ashore for a short period of time Administration will remain afloat upon individual ships.

## 3. EMBARKATION

- a. Each RUC will submit to the BLT Adjutant prior to 1600 3 September 1965 Personnel Accounting Cards (IIM Cards) on each man in their unit. Cards will be in the following order:

- b. Each Alphabetical deck of cards will be secured with a rubber band. Each stack will be identified with a note i.e. "E" Company; EqSec H&SCo, FSR Personnel etc.
- c. Each Reporting Unit will have a representative present at the point of troop embarkation to check off their personnel.
- d. One hour after completion of troop embarkation a representative of each Reporting Unit will report to their respective troop offices. They will be prepared to verify their personnel aboard ship. (This includes having the name, rank, service number, component and RUC of personnel not listed on the roster).
- e. Commanding Officer of troops of the APA and LSD will deliver corrected embarkation rosters with recapitulation sheets to:

#### 4. COMBAT CASUALTY REPORTING

- a. Unit Commanders are responsible for Casualty Cards (NAVMC 10455PD) in the following instances:

  - (2) Personnel known to be captured (CPD).
  - (3) Personnel known to be killed in action and the body not recovered (BNR).
  - (4) Personnel known to have received superficial wounds which do not require the services of a medical officer and which do not result in a loss to his unit.
  - (5) Personnel known to have been buried in temporary or isolated graves. (give co-ordinates).
  - (6) Personnel status is known to change, i.e. MIA to KIA or BNR to KIA.
- b. Upon receipt of a Casualty, BAS will complete a Casualty Card.
- c. Casualty Cards will be filled out in accordance with the detailed instructions contained in Enclosure (2) DivO 3040.1A. The digit code for this organization is '05'.
- d. All casualty cards will be marked with the Unit designation in the upper right hand corner i.e. H&S, "E", "F", "G", "H", D/Btry; 107MM Mortar.
- e. All casualty cards, original and duplicate, will be forwarded to the BLT S-L.
- g. Units will deploy with sufficient Casualty Cards.

5. REPLACEMENTS

- a. Replacements will be assigned to units based on unit requirements as shown through PDS Reports and Combat Casualty Cards.

6. DISCIPLINE, LAW AND ORDER

- a. There will be a clerk from the BLT Adjutants Section aboard each ship to assist the CO of Troops in legal matters.
- b. CO of Troops will request permission from the Commanding Officer of the Ship for Company Commanders to exercise NJP power under Article 15 UCMJ. Contingent upon his approval your NJP authority is as follows:
  - (1) Forfeiture of not more than seven days pay.
  - (2) Extra duties, including fatigue or other duties, for not more than fourteen (14) consecutive days.
  - (3) Restrictions to certain specific limits, with or without suspension from duty; for not more than fourteen (14) consecutive days.
  - (4) Detention of not more than fourteen (14) days pay.
  - (5) Confinement on bread and water or diminished rations for not more than three (3) days.

7. GRAVES REGISTRATION

- a. LW instructions contained in reference (a) the Assistant Adjutant is designated the provincial Graves Registration Officer for the BLT.
- b. If it is necessary to bury dead in a place other than a designated cemetery the information as to the exact location by coordinates will be recorded on the Casualty Card item #23 and the names and units of the Marines who did the burying will be recorded in item #24 of the reverse of the Card. Also, a sketch Map location of the burial point will be forwarded with the card.
- c. Identification of the remains will be determined by one or more of the following:
  - (1) ID Tags.
  - (2) ID Card.
  - (3) If possible, two (2) certificates from individuals who know the deceased and can identify the remains.
- d. Clothing is an important form of identification and will be forwarded with the remains.
- e. Information as to collecting points will be disseminated upon arrival.

8. MORALE AND PERSONNEL SERVICES

a. Leave.

- (1) Emergency Leave may be granted by the BLT Commander at any time.
- (2) Information on Annual Leave will be promulgated at a later date.

b. Liberty.

c. Personal Affairs.

- (1) The Assistant Adjutant is available to assist in filling out necessary documents connected with personal affairs.

d. Postal Services.

- (1) The 2/1 Postal Officer is responsible for the BLT mail.
- (2) The BLT Postal detachment will be attached to H&S Company and will be under the control of the Adjutant. They will have the capabilities of selling stamps and money orders; they will be able to register mail and provide services for Special Delivery.

- (4) Free mail will be provided to the BLT when it is located in certain areas. All units will be informed when Free Mail privileges are in effect. The following regulations govern the use of Free Mail:

  - (b) Items in paragraph (4a) above must be mailed to any place within the United States (Including Puerto Rico or any possession of the United States).

b. Supplies and equipment available.

c. Plan for landing supplies.

(1) Prescribed loads.

- (a) Personnel - All personnel land with basic allowance of ammunition.
- (b) Vehicles - Preloaded vehicles unloaded in accordance with the landing plan.

e. Distribution.

f. Rosupply.

- (1) After landing, BLT 2/1 S-4 will supply all units with rations, water and fuel prior to darkness on D day. A resupply of water for all units will be effected during the morning of D plus 1.
- (2) Unit distribution will be the normal method of supply.
- (3) All requests for emergency resupply will be directed to BLT S-4.

2. EVACUATION AND HOSPITALIZATION

- a. Initially, casualties occurring in helicopters, landing craft, or amphibian vehicles during the ship to shore movement will:

- b. Upon landing, Battalion Surgeon establish a Battalion Aid Station in the vicinity of the EMT 2/1 Command Post (vic J32007).
  - c. After landing casualties will be routed as follows:
    - (1) Primary - To LPH via helicopter or to the APA via landing craft.
    - (2) Secondary - To Battalion Aid Station via helicopter or surface transportation.

### 3. TRANSPORTATION

- a. Helicopter support available prior to, during and after landing operation.
- b. Vehicular support available as required depending on tactical situation.
- c. Landing craft from APA and LSD as required.

### 4. SERVICE

- (a) 20 Marine officers will remain aboard USS Galladain (APA 208) to act as ships platoon.
- (b) Service Platoon, Headquarters and Service Company, 2d Battalion, 1st Marines provide required personnel for Ships Platoon aboard the USS TWO JAMES (LPH-2)

### 5. PERSONNEL

- a. Strength. All units will land at strengths established by Annex A (Troop List) to Operation Order 202-65.
- b. Prisoners of War. See Annex B (Intelligence) to Operation Order 202-65.
- c. Graves Registration. All United States and Republic of Viet Nam Armed Forces (RVNAF) personnel killed in action (VIA) will be evacuated to the LPH.
- d. Civil Affairs. Firm control must be exerted by all combat elements and in particular fire support units to ensure positive identification of targets as hostile before they are taken under fire. Indiscriminate destruction of villages or hamlets is forbidden. Every effort will be made to separate women, children and old men from Viet Cong or Viet Cong suspects giving them all humanitarian consideration possible consistent with operational requirements. See Annex B (Intelligence) to Operation Order 202-65.

a. Personnel Procedures.

(1) Ship to Shore Movement.

(a) Surface. Strict accountability will be kept of all personnel entering landing craft. Commanding Officers of Troops of each ship will establish a system by which a Helicopter Team Card (1. Div 3700/1(1-65) will be collected from each member of a boat team as he enters a landing craft/LVT. Cards for each boat team will be placed in an envelope, sealed and identified with the following: boat team number, landing craft/LVT number and the time of debarkation. Envelopes will be turned in to the Combat Cargo Officer (CCO) or other ship's representatives for retention until the landing craft/LVT has returned from its mission or has been reported safely ashore. Unit Commanders whose personnel will be transported to the LST by landing craft for further movement ashore in LVTs will insure that all personnel have a Helicopter Team Card prepared and turned in upon entering the landing craft and again before entering the LVT.

(b) Air. Personnel being transported ashore by helicopter will turn in a Helicopter Team Card to the Combat Cargo Officer's representative at the debarkation station.

(2) Re-Embarcation. At the completion of re-embarkation, Unit Commanders will submit a Personnel Report to the BLT S-1. This report will list the name, rank, service number, status (WL, XL, ML) and location of all personnel not physically present.

f. Interior Management. Unit Commanders upon establishing their CP's will send two runners to the BLT S-1. Two new runners will be sent to the BLT S-1 after displacement of a Unit CP.

g. Combat Casualty Reporting.

(1) Concept. A Combat Casualty Card will be submitted on each casualty.

(a) Unit Commanders are responsible for submitting Combat Casualty Cards (NWIC 10453-PD) in the following instances:

1. Personnel known to be Missing in Action (MIA).

2. Personnel known to be captured (CPD).

3. Personnel known to be killed in action and the body not recovered (KIA).

4. Personnel known to have received superficial wounds which do not require the services of a Medical Officer and which do not result in a loss of title unit.

5. Personnel status is known to change, i.e. MIA TO KIA OR WNR TO KIA.

6 Personnel known to be killed in action (KIA).

- (b) The BLT Medical Officer is responsible for submitting Combat Casualty Cards on all personnel processed through the BLT Aid Station.
- (c) Combat Casualty Cards are self-explanatory, however, detailed instructions on their use can be found in DivO 3040.1A. The digit code for this organization is "05".
- (d) All Combat Casualty Cards will be marked with the Unit Designation in the upper right hand corner, i.e. H&S, "E", "F", "G", "H", B/Btry, 107MM Mortar Btry.
- (e) Combat Casualty Cards, original and duplicate, will be forwarded to the BLT S-1.
- (f) In the event a casualty is evacuated by helicopter, the destination of the helicopter will be determined from the pilot. This information will immediately be forwarded to the BLT S-1.

**6. MISCELLANEOUS**

a. Uniform and equipment for debarkation.

- (1) Utilities, helmet with camouflage cover (green side out), normal arms, cartridge belt, belt suspender straps. The following equipment will be attached to the cartridge belt as follows: jungle kit, center rear, 2 canteens (filled), left and right rear hip, entrenching tool, left side, poncho folded and rolled attached to center, rear above the jungle kit.
